ROUTES IN SOME CASES PASSING THROUGH OTHER SLEEPING ROOMS IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT THESE DETECTORS ALSO BE TIED INTO THE SYSTEM.

IT IS ALSO REQUIRED THAT THERE BE A MANUAL ALARM PULL STATION AT AN OBVIOUS AND EASILY LOCATED LOCATION ON THE FIRST FLOOR WHERE THE ALARM CAN BE SOUNDED MANUALLY.

A SECOND BASIC REQUIREMENT IS FOR THERE TO BE AT LEAST TWO ROUTES OF ESCAPE FROM EACH FLOOR.

THE GROUND FLOOR HAS A FRONT DOOR AND A SIDE DOOR.

THE SECOND FLOOR HAS A FRONT STAIR AND A BACK STAIR. FOR THESE STAIRS TO COMPLEMENT EACH OTHER IN PROVIDING TWO SEPERATE ROUTES IT IS NECESSARY FOR OCCUPANTS TO TRAVEL THROUGH INTERVENING SLEEPING ROOMS. THIS IS ALLOWED ONLY IF NONE OF THE DOORS ENROUTE ARE OR CAN BE LOCKED. BEDS AND/OR FURNITURE MUST BE CLEAR OF ANY OF THESE DOORS AND A CLEAR PASSAGE WAY PROVIDED THROUGH THESE ROOMS. THE ROUTES OF ESCAPE SHOULD BE MARKED WITH EXIT SIGNS AND EMERGENCY LIGHTING PROVIDED SINCE THESE ROUTES COULD BE VERY CONFUSING IN THE DARK OR UNDER SMOKE CONDITIONS.

THE ENTRYWAY FOR THE FIRST FLOOR SIDE DOOR MUST BE KEPT CLEAR OF ANY ITEMS WHICH WOULD OBSTRUCT CLEAR PASSAGE.
